Performing the Eagle Scout Service Project

- ☑ You are the leader of this project. Although it is acceptable to seek guidance from others, do not let others, especially adults, lead your project. You should, however, be flexible in order to accommodate any unexpected changes.
- ☑ It is very important that you complete this project to the satisfaction of your beneficiary.
- ☑ Remember that you are a representative of the Boy Scouts of America. The image that you project will reflect not only on you and your unit, but also on our council and the Boy Scouts of America, as a whole.

Project Final Plan

- ☑ Read the entire Workbook to understand why the Project Final Plan is highly recommended for use. You will quickly see that it is already structured with sections, which, when completed, will be a great tool to help you complete your project.
- ☑ Share the Project Final Plan with your Eagle Project Coach and consider engaging your unit by having a committee review of your Plan.
- ☑ An approved Tour Plan is required to perform the project. You will need to coordinate this activity with a unit committee member to complete the online Tour Plan process. Understand that San Gabriel Valley Council is requesting a minimum of 2 weeks processing time.
- ☑ Complete a Financing Application as required. Understand that fundraising cannot begin until the application has been approved.

Expectations for Return for Eagle Board of Review

- ☑ Because the Service Project is the most visible part of your Trail to Eagle, the Eagle Board of Review will want to know how you were able to plan and give leadership throughout your Eagle Scout Service Project. You can help streamline this process by making sure to complete the entire Eagle Project Workbook and supplying all necessary documentation, including changes, photographs, etc.
